#### POSITION PROFILE:

This Lead position will be full time (1.0) beginning as soon as possible until Friday July 5, 2023. Under the guidance and the supervision of the Supervisory Officer of the Moose Factory Island DSAB, the Lead will work collaboratively with other leads, school administrators and school staff of Moose Factory Ministik School. Duties include, but not limit to, are:

- Collaborate and liaise with local Indigenous communities, organizations, students and families
- Support efforts to build the knowledge and awareness of all students about Indigenous history, culture and traditions; supporting the development of the Board Action Plan and implementing strategies and actions identified in the Ontario FNMI Education Policy Framework (2007 Framework) and the Ontario FNMI Policy Framework Implementation Plan (2014, Implementation Plan)
- Support the implementation of the MFIDSAB Indigenous Education Advisory Committee
- Liaise and collaborate with school staff, local and regional partners, including other local schools, and ministry planning staff to deepen and broaden the schools' education and career/life planning programs and pathways for all students
- Attend, design and deliver professional learning sessions to facilitate the sharing of insights and promising practices
- Collect, maintain, analyze and report on data to support school improvement planning

#### QUALIFICATIONS:

- Post-secondary education, preferably in education or related field
- Knowledge and understanding of local First Nations communities' history, cultural and traditional practices; and the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action
- Demonstrated successful experience working and collaborating with First Nations, Metis and Inuit communities; as well as education systems and schools
- Possession of expertise in equity and inclusion, strategic planning, partnership development and project management
- Experience in a leadership role, developing and implementing plans to improve programs

- Willingness to travel to required local, regional and provincial meetings
- Preference given to candidates with Cree language, knowledge, history, understanding and successful experience working with local communities: Moose Factory, Moosonee, and the James Bay coast
